We have had the privilege of working with Ginger Ross since November 2019, when she offered to provide a webinar series for our volunteers and staff who advocate for abused, neglected and abandoned children. As she pointed out, it is crucial for child advocacy teams to have a fundamental knowledge of substance use disorder and how our knowledge or lack of knowledge impacts the birth parents' efforts toward sustainable recovery and ultimately the children's permanency outcomes.


